

I thought this book would be good for my 7 year old daughter. It was a bit over my 2 year olds head but at the same time a bit too simple for my 7 year old. The book has kind of a Dr. Seuss "Cat in the hat" type rhythm to it. Maybe some might like that for the sake of remembering the details? I found it a bit annoying as accuracy and clear communication obviously played 2nd and 3rd fiddle to using a word that rhymed. Most of the extreme and exciting things Adoniram went thru weren't mentioned which is understandable as it is a childrens book. It's got that "safe for the whole family" style which unfortunately comes across

insepid.
